I give devise and bequeath all my real and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever unto my son **John Wharton** of Moreton aforesaid Yeoman and my daughter **Ann Doyle** the wife of **Thomas Doyle** of Moreton aforesaid Yeoman. To hold the same unto them my aforesaid son and daughter their heirs executors administrators and aforsigns according to the nature thereof respectively as tenants in common and not as joint tenants absolutely. And I appoint my said son and daughter Executor and Executrix of this my will hereby revoking all other Wills by be at any time heretofore made. In witness whereof I the said Testatrix Esther Wharton have hereunto set my hand this first day of April one thousand and eight hundred and fifty one.
